Advanced Colposcopy: The Complete Lower Genital Tract



Is this educational activity right for me?

Provision of optimal health care for women requires that the health care provider be adept in the management of difficult vulvovaginal and cervical conditions such as abnormal cervical cytology screening tests, recurrent candidiasis, lichen sclerosus, introital dyspareunia, recurrent HPV or herpes virus lesions, and vulvar and cervical intraepithelial neoplasia (VIN and CIN). This ASCCP advanced course best serves those licensed physicians and advanced practice clinicians who are intermediate to advanced in the level of knowledge and treatment of vulvar, vaginal, and cervical diseases. Physician candidates include gynecologists, gynecologic oncologists, family practitioners, dermatologists, pathologists, ob/gyn and family practice residents, and advanced practice clinicians (e.g., nurse practitioners, physicians' assistants, nurse midwives).



Course Competencies and Objectives

This course reflects the current status of clinical knowledge in lower genital tract diagnosis and treatment, including the *Consensus Guidelines for the Management of Women with Abnormal Cervical Cancer Screening Tests* and the *Management of Women with Cervical Intraepithelial Neoplasia or Adenocarcinoma In-situ*. It is designed to improve medical knowledge, practice-based learning, patient outcomes, and/or systems-based practice. Specific goals are set for the learner to obtain upon completion of the course and it is expected the learner will be able to:

- Discuss HPV to include the biology, epidemiology, natural history, and immune response of HPV, as well as understand the costs to society and to the individual of HPV infections, and discuss the efficacy limitations of the HPV vaccines;
- Understand current screening tests for neoplasias of the lower genital tract;
- Apply HPV DNA testing and relevant diagnostic tests to clinical practice in a directed and cost-effective manner;
- Apply screening and management guidelines to women and those selected special populations (e.g., adolescents, post-menopausal women) with cervical cytological abnormalities and cervical intraepithelial neoplasia/adenocarcinoma in-situ;
- Understand the new classification system for vulvar pain syndromes;
- Describe the methods used to diagnose vulvodynia;
- Understand the types of vulvar pain that respond to surgery and be familiar with the surgical techniques;
- Understand the various conditions associated with vulvar edema;
- Recognize the gross and histologic changes of lichen sclerosus;
- Understand the various treatments for pruritus;
- Know the differential diagnosis of pigmented vulvovaginal conditions; and,
- Utilize correct treatments for various STI's including herpes, molluscum contagiosum, and HIV.



Course Educational Methods

Lectures: Each day, the learners will attend general and concurrent sessions related to their areas of interest. Each session will conclude with a question and answer period led by the presenter(s). Throughout the lectures and question and answer periods, faculty members utilize an Audience Response System. The faculty uses these group responses to readdress items not answered correctly by the target goal percentage. This immediate feedback helps course attendees identify their own weaknesses and allows them to follow up with the faculty onsite.

Pattern Recognition/Case

Sessions: Intense and interactive exposure to multiple vulvovaginal cases and cervical cases help to sharpen assessment and biopsy placement skills. Over 500 different vulvovaginal and cervical images are presented during the span of a given course, allowing learners to practice recognition of various vulvovaginal and cervical conditions. Interactive sessions on the techniques and procedures used in the screening and management of lower genital tract conditions are conducted.



Interactive Case Study Sessions: Several interactive sessions will be used throughout the course to test medical knowledge and practice-based learning skills on various vulvar, vaginal and cervical conditions. Learners, in conjunction with faculty leadership, will review cases, vote on their diagnosis and discuss what management and treatment course they would pursue and why.

Panel Discussions: For selected topics, learners will direct questions to panels of experts on how to integrate reported advances into their practices. The faculty will present their evidence-based perspectives so that learners can determine what may be best practice in their clinical settings.

Course Materials

ASCCP is pleased to provide online access to all syllabus materials at no additional charge to attendees. This full-size, full-color set of slides is available for your review approximately three weeks prior to the course. All registered attendees will receive an email with instructions on how to access the syllabus. Attendees may download the syllabus prior to the course and may bring their laptop in order to access the syllabus images during the course. If an attendee prefers a printed syllabus, they can print it from the online version or pre-order one from ASCCP for an additional fee. Each learner is asked to select their syllabus preference during the registration process. Pre-ordered syllabi will be available for pick-up onsite.

Electronic Syllabus Only (\$0): Attendees who select the electronic syllabus option will be responsible for downloading the presentations or printing the presentations prior to the course. ASCCP will not provide printed syllabi to attendees unless the printed option was selected during registration.
