Is this Educational Activity Right for Me?

In late 2009, the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists set out new guidelines for cervical cancer screening [ACOG Practice Bulletin no. 109: Cervical cytology screening. *Obstet Gynecol.* 2009 Dec;114(6):1409-20] which redefined clinicians' initiation, frequency, and duration of Pap and HPV testing. The 2006 *ASCCP Consensus Guidelines for the Management of Women with Abnormal Cervical Cancer Screening Tests and Cervical Intraepithelial Neoplasia (CIN)/ Adenocarcinoma in situ (AIS)* established broad concepts governing the management of women with abnormalities. General guidelines, however, can be difficult to apply to specific clinical situations. This course has been developed to provide clinicians with a working understanding of the science underlying the recommendations, as well as the ability to best utilize these guidelines in the interest of patients.



The Advanced Colposcopy: Case-Based Course best serves all intermediate and advanced level clinicians who perform and interpret the results of cervical cancer screening tests and who diagnose and manage preinvasive disease of the lower female genital tract (e.g., gynecologists, family physicians, advanced practice clinicians (to include NPs, CNMs, PA-Cs), gynecologic oncologists, and residents in obstetrics-gynecology and family medicine). As with other ASCCP Advanced Colposcopy courses, learners should already be familiar with the core natural history of human papillomaviruses (HPV) and cervical/vulvar/vaginal intraepithelial neoplasia (CIN/VIN/VaIN); the gross and colposcopic anatomy of the cervix, vagina, and vulva; and, the fundamental principles underlying the management of lower genital tract diseases.



Course Competencies and Objectives

This course has been designed to improve clinician competencies and practice and thus improve patient care. Upon completion of this activity, learners will be able to:

- Apply an understanding of the epidemiology and natural history of HPV and cervical cancer precursors to the rational screening of women for cervical cancer (medical knowledge);
- Apply the basic and clinical science underlying the 2006 ASCCP Consensus Guidelines to the individualized management of abnormal screening tests and preinvasive histologic lesions (systems-based practice, practice-based learning, patient care);
- Manage women from special populations (e.g., adolescent, postmenopausal, and pregnant women) with abnormal screening results and CIN/AIS (systems-based practice, practice-based learning, patient care);
- Implement cost-effective management of CIN, VIN, VaIN, and HPV testing and vaccination (practice-based learning, patient care); and,
- Manage women treated for lower genital tract disease to identify recurrent or persistent lesions (practice-based learning, patient care).

Course Educational Methods

Case Sessions/Group Discussions

In daily, faculty-led small group discussions, learners will work through case-based modules that illustrate the application of guidelines in individual cases, with review of the underlying epidemiology and natural history. These sessions will provide intense and interactive exposure to multiple patient cases and will allow the learners to practice both assessing their understanding of the guidelines and selecting the proper screening and management pathways for patients. The case study discussions will utilize an audience response system, allowing the attendees to practice what has been learned and to receive immediate feedback.



Open Question and Answer Sessions

There will be daily open question and answer periods led by the presenters, including “Participant Cases” and “Difficult Cases” sessions. In the former, participants in small groups will present their own complicated cervical or vulvovaginal patient histories and images before the faculty and their colleagues for consensus management recommendations and discussion. In the latter, the combined faculty solicit questions from the full audience; these are then read and addressed for discussion and consensus recommendations. In addition, educators seek teaching opportunities at breaks to answer specific questions one-on-one.

Course Syllabus

The program syllabus containing the cases and slides from presentations will be available to attendees after the course. The program syllabus contains the cases and slides from presentations as available from the course faculty. A supplemental syllabus consisting of important CME and course information will be distributed onsite.
