

2025 CSCCP 11th Annual Conference: A Landmark Event in Cervical Cancer Prevention and Control in China

The 2025 CSCCP conference was successfully held in May 15-17, 2025, in Tianjin, China. With the theme "Upholding Tradition, Innovating Progress: Advancing Cervical Cancer Prevention and Control Strategies", the conference featured one main venue and 7 Branch venues with 12 specialized sessions. Providing relevant information for clinical decision-making, these focused on cutting-edge topics, such as AI-based Pap cytology screening, extended HPV genotyping, HPV tests with self-collection, correlation between Pap cytology/pathology and colposcopy, HPV vaccine advancements, and postmenopausal management. More than 1,500 clinicians and researchers attended the conference on-site, and the main venue's online views exceeded 110,000. The conference obtained about 10 million persons/times views, in collaboration with Weibo.



160 Chinese and international experts from multiple disciplines had their presentation and attended the discussions or debates in various topics in the conference. Invited international scholars included Dr. Edward J. Mayeaux, Lexington Medical Center, (previous President of ASCCP), Dr. Chengquan Zhao, University of Pittsburgh, Dr. Maggie Cruickshank (Previous President of European Federation of Colposcopy), Dr. Theodore Pepera (Vice Chair of the IFCPC Education Committee), and Dr. Jeffrey Tan (previous president of Australia colposcopy association). Their presentations covered global guidelines and technological innovations, bridging international

standards with clinical practice.



Finally, the President of CSCCP, Dr. Lihui Wei, expressed gratitude for all efforts and emphasized the conference as a high-quality academic platform to address challenges like HPV precision intervention and fertility protection. She invited attendees to translate insights into practice and announced the 12th CSCCP Conference in Changsha from May 15–17, 2026, aiming to jointly advance cervical cancer prevention and women’s health. The event fostered interdisciplinary dialogue, integrated AI and global guidelines, and reinforced CSCCP’s role in shaping cervical cancer control strategies, marking a significant step in safeguarding women’s health through innovation and collaboration.
